



FINANCIAL and MEMBERSHIP REPORTS:

- Financial Secretary: Ed Delgado gave his report on expenses, income and membership. Written reports are available to members upon request. We currently have 392 members. Ed reminded us that reports on our fraternity hours are due now you can use the formal sheet or just write your hours on a slip of paper. To date, only 25 Knights have reported their activities.
- Treasurer: André Casias gave the Treasurer's report of 12/31/2022 account balances in the Council's bank accounts. Written reports are available to members upon request.
- Bingo Report: Ron Ondrak gave his report. Written reports are available to members upon request. For the month of December, Bingo was up about \$280 (there were 2 days canceled due to weather). Bingo is \$7,800 ahead of budget through December for the Fraternal year (July-June). Help is always needed and welcome. If you're unable to volunteer on a regular basis, please let Ron know if you want to be put on the substitute list to be called when needed.
- Membership Report: Membership Chairman Byron Day reported that there will be a First through
 Third Degree Exemplification at IHM after the 12:30 p.m. Mass on Sunday, January 29th. Any
 Knight who is only First Degree may also attend and achieve their Third Degree making them
 eligible to be an officer and also able to earn their Fourth Degree.

- Chancellor: Mike McCarthy excused.
- Trustee: Ron Ondrak (1 year), Jim Bernatow (2 year) & Ed Getsch (3 year) Jim reported that an audit meeting will take place in the hall at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday, January 28th. Anyone may attend. Ron reported there will be a budget meeting at a date to be determined in March.

PROGRAM REPORTS: Deputy GK Patrick Day

- Family Program: Mike McCarthy excused.
- Faith Director: Kent Closson No report.
- Life Director: Vernon Bustos No report.
- Community: Chris Gaul Chris reported that a move was accomplished on December 28th. As there was lots of help and not a lot to move, it was all finished in about 15 minutes. The person we helped is a Knight who moved to Colorado and will be joining our Council. Kent Closson reported that one of the benches near the Ten Commandments at IHM is falling over. Chris Gaul will take a look and determine what needs to be done.
- Special Olympics: Mike Chacon excused.

- Squires: James Bernard reported the squires Christmas party was held on December 17th with food, Bingo and a gift exchange. The squires sold "Keep Christ in Christmas" items at IHM and St. John Paul II during Advent. Father Andrew attended the squires' meeting on December 18th holding a Q&A and hearing confessions. Four squires, four counselors and one squire's sister helped with the move on December 28th. Also one of the squires brought a tin of homemade Christmas goodies as a "Welcome to Colorado" gift. Our upcoming monthly meeting will be held on January 15th (3rd Sunday) at 2 p.m. in the hall. We hope to have an investiture for up to two new squires. Everyone is welcome.
- Vocations Ken Allscheid reported he has been in contact with the new director of vocations —
 Father Jason Wallace. While our Council supported 8 seminarians with \$500 checks last fall, other
 Councils have stepped up, and there may not be 8 needing our support in the spring. We are
 looking at other ways we may be able to support seminarians. We will also help with lunches at
 discernment retreats (dates to be determined).

FOURTH DEGREE: Clark Musser — excused. Ken Allscheid reported that the Color Corps has increased from 8 to 16 members, with 13 being certified on October 29th. There will be a 4th Degree Exemplification on Saturday, February 4th in Brighton. Ken briefly explained that the 4th Degree is the Patriotic Degree - supporting veterans, active military and members of our government. Our Assembly (1966) has members from three Councils - IHM, Holy Cross and St. John Paul II. The most visible aspect is the Color Corps (an optional part and currently the Assembly is reimbursing the cost of the uniform). The Assembly assists at funerals and other events, has a yearly breakfast for Veterans, supplies wreaths for Wreaths Across America (placed by families of veterans in December) and has an annual outing for dinner and a show at Candlelight Dinner Playhouse.

FIELD AGENT REPORT: Waiting for a replacement, following the death of Craig Harris. **DISTRICT DEPUTY (DD) REPORT**: Tom Walls — The District Deputy reinforced the importance of filling out fraternal hours - they were recently used by the State Deputy to defend the tax exempt status of the Knights. Tom conveyed that Supreme has made online membership free for the rest of the year. The District Deputy noted there will also be a First through Third Degree Exemplification at Nativity of Our Lord in Broomfield on February 26th. Tom commented that at the District Meeting on the 21st, he will cover information from the mid-year meeting. There will also be a presentation on Cor Meetings. Cor Meetings are for men with prayer and readings — you don't have to be a Knight or even Catholic to participate. [The Cor Meeting is a faith-based initiative of the Supreme Council to form and strengthen Knights and the Catholic men of the parish in faith and virtue. Each Cor Meeting does this by strengthening relationships with Jesus Christ and one another, through the three Key Elements of Prayer, Formation and Fraternity.] Tom said that the January March for Life has been canceled in Colorado this year. There will be an event celebrating the overturn of Roe v. Wade in June at Cherry Creek park.

Knight of the Month - Warren Novak

Warren grew up in south Omaha, Nebraska. This neighborhood has many Catholic parishes. His mother was Irish, so they went to the Irish parish eight blocks away instead of the Croatian church across the street. In an area about the size of Immaculate Heart of Mary parish, Omaha had over 20 parishes, most with schools. The Croatian Sts. Peter and Paul parish is proud of its native son Cardinal Blase Cuprich, Archbishop of Chicago.

Warren moved to Northglenn in 1981 and started attending IHM where his sister (IHM's Sister Sharon) was Director of Religious Education. He met his lovely wife Kathie there, and they married in 1983. They are the proud parents of



three sons and two daughters. They have nine grandchildren, all of whom live less than ten minutes away.

Warren started with Northwestern Bell in Omaha and transferred to Mountain Bell in Denver, which became US West, then Qwest, then Century Link, and finally Lumen Technologies when he retired in 2022 after 48 years.

In 1983, Warren began working as a volunteer with Northglenn ambulance service, and later served as a Commerce City EMT and paramedic, where a unit would "roll" (go-out) 1 to 20 times a day. His paid job for the phone company was 7am-3:30pm. He was on-call for ambulance duty 6pm-5am. Warren learned to sleep between calls.

Warren served as an EMT and paramedic for 25 years. He taught classes on all manner of skills needed by ambulance workers. Warren has delivered babies on calls, which he says always happened in the bathroom, the smallest room in the house.

Warren is on the IHM Finance committee. Kathie is on Pastoral council. She was also on Northglenn City Council for eleven years and was Northglenn's mayor for eight years.

Warren was a Cubmaster for Pack 420, coached soccer for three seasons, and coached inline hockey for ten years. This is played on inline skates, not ice. He loved playing hockey with sons and buddies. At IHM Warren taught classes on marriage preparation, baptism to new parents, and confirmation. He currently is teaching religious ed to middle school students. He also picks up for the Food Bank three days a week. Warren runs the IHM usher program that now uses a scheduling app.

For his boundless energy and service to our community and IHM, Warren Novak has earned the honor of Knight of the Month.

In less than 20 minutes, the truck was empty, the apartment was filled, and the job was done. Brandon and the volunteers gathered in the shelter of the empty truck for a photo before giving him a tin of homemade Christmas goodies as a welcome to Colorado gift and saying farewell.

All Council 7502 Knights are reminded that Applications for the High School and College Scholarships are available. Scholarship candidates must be a child or grandchild of a Council 7502 member in good standing or a deceased past member who was in good standing at the time of his death.

For the two high school scholarships, a candidate must be an incoming freshman who has been accepted to a Catholic High School. The \$1,500 first year scholarship is renewable each of the remaining three years of High School if requirements are met as set forth in the Application form.

The college scholarship is \$5,000 for just the first year of college, as more fully explained in the College Scholarship Application Form. Three scholarships are available for the coming 2023-2024 school year.

Intelligently Defending Our Catholic Faith

As many of us know, the Augustine Institute in Greenwood Village, Colorado, produces wonderful educational programs for Catholics. Some of us are now taking at IHM "The Case for Jesus" Lectio Study Series (9 sessions) by the highly respected and well-educated Brant Pitre, Ph.D. The series and Pitre's book, *The Case for Jesus*, provide the logic and evidence that (1) the four Gospels were indeed written by Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, (2) were timely written and are reliable, (3) Jesus did, in Jewish ways, reveal that he was the Messiah (the "Christ") and the Son of God, the Father, as explained in the Gospels, and (4) the other so-called 'Gospels' are not reliable. Bishop Barron knows Dr. Pitre and praises *The Case for Jesus* book.

The Case for Jesus book, might be a good gift for a family member who is questioning his Catholic faith or who is going off to college where attacks on the Catholic faith are common. Maybe we should give a copy to every Scholarship winner, to help him or her intelligently defend our Catholic Faith.

Special Olympics Update by Mike Chacon

Special Olympics hosts 21 sports and 16 regional and State events. Colorado consists of 5 regions. Council 7502 is technically is in the Northeast region and includes the Front Range from Denver to Fort Collins and eastward to Sterling and Fort Morgan. The Denver region includes the metro area. Our scope will include parts of both regions depending on the distance the volunteers are willing to travel. Currently, they are in the winter sport season that goes from January to April. Ski events are held at Copper Mountain and Eldora Mountain Ski Resorts. Basketball and Ice Skating are held at various regional locations. Typically, they need a total of 15-20 volunteers for an all-day event that goes from 7am to 4pm.

The Special Olympics has several fund raising events that also need volunteers. The Polar Plunge is held at several lakes in March and April. A golf tournament is held in July/August. A Plane Pull event is held at the Broomfield Airport in August/September. The Battle of the Bats Softball charity event is in September at Pioneer Park in Commerce City.

Typically, the Knights of Columbus are involved in "Day of Volunteering" that basically means the volunteer for a single event or tournament. A Knights Honor Guard is sometimes present at the Opening Ceremonies and award distributions. The Knights have also provided food at events.
