

Knight of the Month is Paul May

Paul was born in Salt Lake City on June 1, 1944, five days before Allied forces launched the invasion of Europe. He was a fifth generation with his ancestors arriving in 1847. His father was transferred to Boise, Idaho, where Paul graduated high school. He worked full time and attended night school. Paul moved to Denver in 1962. He was in the Army Reserves from 1965-71, completing his hitch as a First Sergeant.

Paul made a career in the hospital laundry and linen industry, working his way up from deliveries as a young man to sales later on. He married his lovely wife Maggie

May in 1967 at Denver's Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. Paul and Maggie lived in Northglenn for 26 years and Westminster for 24.

Paul has led an active life. His road bicycle has 23,000 miles on it. He joined the Keystone Ski Patrol at age 46, and stayed on 17 years. (The average age of a Ski Patrol member is 27.) He has run 58 races, including six 26-mile marathons, plus half-marathons and many 10K's. He also rides a motorcycle, golfs, and fly fishes.

Paul went through RCIA and joined the Church in 2013. He subsequently did five years as an RCIA instructor. He did a Christ Renews His Parish retreat and then worked on five more. At CRHP he met the Knights of Columbus and joined Council 7502. Paul was Inside Guard and ran for Deputy Grand Knight in 2021. The GK nominee was unable to accept the position, so Paul became Grand Knight. Paul is also the Purser for Fourth Degree Assembly 1966.

Many Hands Make the Lifting Light



When Zach Politzki decided to move from his longtime home in Denver to be closer to his son's family in North Carolina, he knew all he needed was to ask and his Brother Knights would gladly help. At 9 AM on May 13th, a moving crew consisting of 5 Knights, 3 Columbian Squires, and 3 Squires' Counselors met at Zach's home where they were greeted by his familiar smiling face, fresh donuts, and hot coffee.
