GRAND KNIGHT'S LETTER – Douglas Blondin

Brother Knights, Ladies Auxiliary and IHM Congregation:

As we start a new fraternal year, I am honored and humbled to have been elected the next Grand Knight of Council 7502. I am most grateful to all who have made the Council what it is today. I give special thanks to my Grand Knight predecessors. In this first letter, I thought I'd give you some background on your new GK.

I was born in Vermont and am a Cradle Catholic - baptized as an infant, made my First Communion in 2nd grade and my Confirmation as a 6th grader. I lived in

Vermont through the completion of my Bachelor's Degree at the University of Vermont. A job with AT&T brought me to Colorado in the summer of 1982 and I immediately started attending Immaculate Heart of Mary. In August I was off to the University of Wisconsin-Madison for a year through an AT&T program to get my Master's Degree (both degrees in Computer Science). I came back in August 1983 and have been here ever since.

My most visible role at IHM is likely as photographer for various events. If you recall the Journey Days festival, I was running all over the grounds (and on the roof !!!) taking photos. Among other projects, I documented the church renovation in 2008-2009.

Regarding my Knights journey, I didn't make my first degree until June 2007 – when I was finally asked by the late great Sir Knight OD Serrano (personal invitation really does work !!!). A month later, I would make my second and third degrees.

I served as Warden for the Fraternal year starting July 2008. The following year, I served as Deputy Grand Knight under GK Jim Befort. However, when elections came up in 2010, I didn't believe that I was ready for the position of Grand Knight.

I would make my fourth degree in February 2020. In June 2021 I would be elected Recorder for the Council and have served in that role for last two years.

Shortly we'll be celebrating the 247th birthday of our nation. May you have a good & safe time as you gather with family & friends for the festivities.

Just as it took a lot of work to create our nation and to continue our "experiment" of democracy, it will take a lot of effort to continue the good deeds of our Council. As I approach the role of Grand Knight with a sense of wonder and awe, what comforts me is thinking of all the good men, women, and children we have in our parish. While I know there will be many tasks that will fall to me as Grand Knight, the real work is accomplished by the many people who work the various events of our Council. I trust that you will continue to give of your time and talents — enabling our Council to continue serving the needs of our parish and community.

- GK Paul May read a new resolution that has been introduced by members of the scholarship committee to make clear the awarding of scholarships to recipients and to clarify the process in the event of a gap year. The resolution will be published in the next Newsletter. At the July meeting we will have any discussion on the resolution and then vote on it.

FINANCIAL and MEMBERSHIP REPORTS:

- Financial Secretary: Ed Delgado gave the report on expenses, income and membership. Written reports are available to members upon request. We currently have 383 members.
- Treasurer: André Casias gave the Treasurer's report of 5/31/2023 account balances in the Council's bank accounts. Written reports are available to members upon request.
- Bingo Report: Ron Ondrak gave his report. Written reports are available to members upon request. In case you haven't heard, Turn II Bingo lost their lease on the space. Our last session was May 31st which was crazy with a "Must Go" on all progressives. Turn II Bingo is looking for a new location but it will be a number of months at best. On June 15th, we will be starting sessions on Thursdays only (11:15 Early Bird and Noon Bingo) at The Bingo Company (64th & Wadsworth). The only other daytime session available is Monday. This is not seen as the most desirable day but we may consider adding it depending on how everything goes. The Bingo committee met. With only 1 day, revenue will likely be cut in half. At this point, we will continue funding NKCHA, IHM Food Bank and Scholarships. This will likely result in the draw down of the bank accounts (good from the standpoint of the State wanting us to spend Bingo funds). Likely some of our approved \$195,000 approved budget will be held in reserve as we see how it all unfolds. We will reassess the situation in a few months.
- Membership: Byron Day the membership drive on June 3rd & 4th was a huge success signing up 5 new e-members and 3 transfers. Transferee Jerome Rodarte is here tonight. Thanks to all who handed out prayers cards and greeted men after Masses. Thanks to the Deacons and Priests for their endorsements and especially to Deacon Rich for getting the video and announcements setup for each Mass. Each new e-member was invited to our June 13th Council meeting and the exemplification on June 25th at 2 p.m. Father Andrew will fill in for Father Ernest at the ceremony and reception the Grand Knight, Ladies Auxiliary and Squires will also be part of the reception program. Consider inviting someone to become an e-member free at KofC.org/joinus with code shown on that page. Byron will be stepping down as membership director. He thanks the committee Paul May, Dave Paul, Kent Closson, Mike Paplow, Bob Korn, Jim Peterson and Ed Getsch. Also thanks to State Membership Director Mark Germann and District Deputy Tom Walls.

COUNCIL 7502

Resolution 2022-2023 - No: 03 Scholarship Procedures

WHEREAS: It is the purpose of this Resolution to redefine the Scholarship procedures to address various situations that have occurred to clarify how they should be managed when they occur,

WHEREAS: Council 7502 conducts selected fund raising activities each year, determined by the Council, to raise money and deposit profits into its College Scholarship Fund to be used to award Scholarships to first year College and /or Trade Schools students, and,

WHEREAS: Council 7502 uses selected Bingo proceeds deposited into a High School Scholarship Fund to be awarded to first year Catholic High School Students, and to previous High School Scholarship awardees that maintain a GPA of 2.7 or higher, and activities requirements specified in their Scholarship Application, and,

WHEREAS: Scholarships are awarded to Children, and Grandchildren of Knights of Council 7502 that are in good standing, and of deceased Knights of Council 7502 that were in good standing, and,

WHEREAS: Council 7502 awards up to three (3) \$5,000.00 Scholarships each year for incoming first-year students to a College or Trade School, in which they have been accepted, from Council funds that are available in its College Scholarship Fund or from sufficient Bingo funds that are available, and,

AND: Council 7502 awards up to two (2) \$1,500.00 Catholic High School Scholarships for incoming first-year students and continuing Catholic High School Scholarship renewal to prior awardees that have meet the required grade and activities as specified in their Scholarship Application and as sufficient Bingo funds are available, and,

RECIPIENT REFUNDS: If a scholarship awardee drops out of school, any portion of their unused scholarship funds awarded shall be returned to Council 7502, and,

AWARDEE FORFEITURE: If a College or Trade School Scholarship awardee decides to defer College/Trade school entrance beyond the coming academic year, the award will be forfeited. The next-ranked applicant will move up to receive a Scholarship for his/her upcoming first year so that up to three scholarships are awarded, and,

The forfeiting awardee will be eligible to reapply for first year Scholarship for College or Trade School but should not apply until their desired entrance academic year.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That a copy of this procedures resolution once voted upon and passed by a $2/3^{rd}$'s vote of the membership present, be included in the minutes of this meeting and be maintained in the historical records of Council 7502.
