August 2023 Newsletter

Our faith includes two August celebration events - The Transfiguration of the Lord on August 6th (not itself a Holy Day of obligation but it falls on a Sunday this year) and the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on August 15th (a Holy Day).

Reflect on The Transfiguration where Jesus takes Peter, James and John the brother of James up on a high mountain. Jesus is then transfigured - His face shone like the sun and His clothes became as white as light. Moses and Elijah appear and talk with Jesus. Then a voice from the clouds says "This is my Son, whom I love; with Him I am well pleased. Listen to Him!". (Based on Matthew 17)

If we somehow were hidden and watching the scene, what would we have thought? Naturally knowing how events unfolded influences our present understanding of the scene. But what if we only had the knowledge available to us at the time of the event? The scene would likely seem quite mysterious and incomprehensible.

That makes me think about some of the events I've encountered in my life and didn't understand at the time. Often minutes, days or months later, I'd learn something that revealed the blessing of the earlier event. Others events remain a mystery to me. We must trust in the Lord that they occur for a reason and pray for His guidance.

Children are a blessing (and often a mystery!) and before my next letter many will head back to school. For some that will mean heading off to college - perhaps to a place far away and the child's first extended stay away from home. Let's keep families in our prayers as they deal with the inevitable changes that "growing up" brings to all. These college students will encounter many new situations where they need to make choices. Let's pray that they invoke the guidance of our Lord in making wise decisions and that their not-so-wise choices provide learning opportunities without long-term negative consequences.

The remaining days of summer will likely be filled with many vacations. Let's keep families in our prayers that they will have safe travels, that it's a good time for family bonding and makes memories they will cherish for many years. Vivat Jesus!
