## Knight of the Month-Jim Archer

Jim Archer was born in Denver in 1946. He was a lifelong Denver area resident, passing away at his home on October 14, 2023 surrounded by his family. He was 77 years old.

Jim attended Holy Family Catholic School and worked for many years as a construction project manager. He also sold insurance, and most recently in his life, was a calming face at many funerals, working for Dignity Memorial as a funeral assistant. He is survived by Margie, his beloved wife off 55 years; children, grandchildren, and many extended family members and friends.



Jim joined the Knights in 2000. He made his Major Degrees the same year and became Sir Knight in the Fourth Degree in 2006. From the start he stood out as a hard worker. After being in the Council less than three years he was selected as Knight of the Year in 2003.

This is the speech from Jim's induction to the Council Hall of Honor:

"It is my pleasure to introduce Jim Archer, 2017 Hall of Honor inductee, a brother Knight, co-worker and friend. He has been accompanied thru the last forty-nine years by his fantastic wife Margie. They are blessed with three sons; Matt, wife Monica; Joe, wife Kate; and Ken, wife Jamie. They have eight grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

Jim spent four years in the U.S. Navy during Vietnam as a flight simulator instructor and doing electronics maintenance. After the military, he was in industrial construction for thirty-five years; primarily wastewater, water filtration, and power plants. He did mechanical and electrical work along with computer-aided drafting. He currently is a driver for Olinger Funeral Homes.

Margie has held many offices in the Ladies Auxiliary which she got going again in 2008. She also worked bingo breakfasts, fish fries, spaghetti dinners, major degree and 4th degree ladies programs, Christmas parties for the kids, bake sales, baby showers, and most other auxiliary functions.

Jim has been a member of Council 7502 for seventeen years and Assembly 1966 for eleven years. He has been very active. He has held the offices of Inside Guard, Warden, Advocate, Chancellor, and Recorder.

Jim was Knight of the Year and then he and Margie were Family of the Year.

Jim has worked the Knights breakfast from his entry into the Knights. We now find him preparing the omelets to order each breakfast. He has worked in preparation and cleanup of Spaghetti Dinners and Fish Fries. We used to have a 9 News Health Fair at the Hall. Jim was a volunteer working this event. He worked Tootsie Roll Fund Raiser. He has been a volunteer working our main fund raiser Bingo for several years. He helped with one of our elderly moves for social services.

He did what I consider one of the hardest, yet extremely important, jobs within the council. Jim was the Newsletter editor for six years. This required keeping all council members up to date with what was happening and when. He edited information from many sources into our newsletter and it had to fit without exceeding the first-class mail weight limit.

Jim has been a member of the Assembly Color Guard serving at Knights events and funerals for our members. Jim has been a Eucharistic minister at church."

Jim was member of St. Mark's parish and had a deep devotion to the Sacred Heart. A Rosary was held at St. Mark's on October 24, 2023 followed by a Funeral Mass celebrated by 11 priests and deacons with 8 more deacons in the congregation. Many of his brother Knights and Ladies Auxiliary members attended. There was a Fourth Degree Color Guard. A luncheon followed.
