GRAND KNIGHT'S LETTER – Douglas Blondin

Brother Knights, Ladies Auxiliary and IHM Congregation:

I pray that you continue to have a good Easter season. The season will come to an end on May 19th with Pentecost. The word comes from the Greek word pentekoste, which means 50th - Pentecost Sunday coming 50 days after Easter. Pentecost also comes 10 days after the Ascension with the timing giving us the concept of novena - nine days of prayer. Traditionally, the church prays a novena to the Holy Spirit in the days before Pentecost.

Pentecost commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other disciples. It marks the beginning of the Christian church's mission to the world.

At our Confirmation we received the gifts of the Holy Spirit - Wisdom, Knowledge, Understanding, Right Judgment, Courage, Reverence and Awe & Wonder. May we use these gifts so that we can do the work of discipleship that each one of us is called to do.

A popular tradition is to wear red to Mass on Pentecost - representing the "tongues of fire" of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:3). I urge you to do your part to make our church blazing in red on Pentecost and visibly show the presence of the Holy Spirit in our community.

The end of the month brings us Memorial Day - often seen as the unofficial start of summer. As we gather with family & friends, recall the purpose of the day is to honor and mourn those who died while serving in the US Armed Forces. Please set aside a moment in a prayer of Thanksgiving for all those who sacrificed so that we can enjoy the freedoms of our country. And thanks to all those living who have also done their part in this mission.

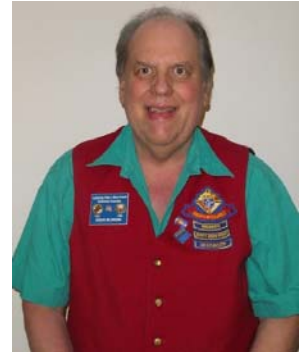

Philippians 3:8-14

⁸ More than that, I even consider everything as a loss because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have accepted the loss of all things and I consider them so much rubbish, that I may gain Christ ⁹ and be found in him, not having any righteousness of my own based on the law but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God, depending on faith ¹⁰ to know him and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by being conformed to his death, ¹¹ if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

¹² It is not that I have already taken hold of it or have already attained perfect maturity, but I continue my pursuit in hope that I may possess it, since I have indeed been taken possession of by Christ Jesus.

¹³ Brothers, I for my part do not consider myself to have taken possession. Just one thing: forgetting what lies behind but straining forward to what lies ahead, ¹⁴ I continue my pursuit toward the goal, the prize of God's upward calling, in Christ Jesus.

Papal Message of the Month


"It is a discernment that is not easy to make, not easy. But it must be done, and decisions must be made on this. It will not be Rome to tell you what you should do, no: because you have the charism. We have the ideas, the orientations, the advice, but you have the charism, you have the Holy Spirit for this. If Rome were to begin to make the decisions it would be a blow to the Holy Spirit, who works in the particular Churches.

"This process is initiating in many parts of the world, and it is natural that there be some resistance – it is natural – and some difficulty in taking this step. But remember that attachment to our history and to the meaningful places of our tradition must not prevent the newness of the Spirit from tracing paths, especially when the Church's journey requires it. The Lord asks of us an attitude of vigilance, lest it happen to us "as in the days of Noah", when the people, all intent on business as usual, did not realize that the flood was coming (cf. Lk 17:26-27). We need open eyes and attentive hearts to grasp the signs of the times and look ahead! I recommend to everyone, not just bishops, to discern what the Holy Spirit wants for your Churches. And this the bishops must do, the decision, but you must all do it to tell the bishops what you feel and how, the ideas... It is the whole body of the diocese that must help the bishop in this discernment. Then he takes responsibility for the decision."

FOURTH DEGREE NEWS

The Fourth Degree Color Corps had an active month. On March 28, 12 men in regalia were at the Holy Thursday Mass. They led the Blessed Sacrament around the church, down the corridor, and to the parish center where it was displayed for adoration. Two Knights were posted guarding the Eucharist from 8pm till midnight. At midnight in past years the pastor would simply retrieve the monstrance and place the Eucharist in the sanctuary.

Father Ernest Bayer quickly came up with a better idea. He had Knights walk before and after him to the monstrance, as if Roman soldiers arresting Our Lord in the Garden of Gethsemane. Fr. Ernest then carried the Blessed Sacrament surrounded by Knights to a special sanctuary in a small parish center room, which Father said symbolized the tomb where Jesus was laid after his crucifixion. It was a powerful experience for the Color Corps.

On April 18 seven Color Corps attended the funeral for Phil Carney. Phil was a pillar of our community in so many ways. He was a lector with a strong clear voice and a long time Scoutmaster. He is in the Council Hall of Honor. Sir Knight Paul May read the letters of condolences and SK Larry Allwine presented them to the family.

District Marshall Don Sweeney gave Color Corps training on April 20 at the hall. A dozen new and old members were certified on attire, sword handling, marching moves, and wearing the beret.

The Color Corps is the visible arm of the Knights. As such, they attend a Corporate Mass on a rotating basis at Holy Cross, St. John Paul II and IHM parishes. On April 21 seven members led the celebrants in and out of the 9am IHM Mass. In addition to seeing, parishioners could also smell and taste as the Council was selling burritos after masses to raise money for seminarians.

If you have a no longer needed sword they can be used by new Color Corps members. A legacy sword carries extra meaning to a new member, knowing they are carrying on the century-plus tradition of the Fourth Degree Color Corps.

A new program from Supreme is asking for swords be donated to help new Fourth Degree members in Korea. They need to be in good condition, have no personal names, and conform with correct color and style. Details to follow.

Special thanks go out to Color Corps Commanders Joe Montoya and Carl Cogar. These hardworking Sir Knights wish to step down after years of dedicated service. The Assembly asks that you please prayerfully consider taking over this important role.

Throughout the National Eucharistic Revival, local communities are gathering tinder in response to God's invitation for renewal, calling on the Holy Spirit to bring the flame.

In keeping with this vision, the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will accompany Jesus from city to city, lighting hearts on fire along four different routes across the United States. Then all four routes will converge, at the National Eucharistic Congress in July 2024, all these flames will blaze together.

Join (St. Junipero Serra Route - West) the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, as it passes through Denver, with a celebration of Sunday Mass at 10:30 am on June 9th at the Cathedral Basilica of the Immaculate Conception in Denver, followed by a short (one mile) Eucharistic Procession through downtown Denver to Holy Ghost. Join talks on the Eucharist by the Augustine Institute. Theology professors from the Augustine Institute will offer talks on the Eucharist at Holy Ghost after the Eucharistic Procession. There will be an English session at 2:00pm and then a Spanish session at 3:00pm when Spanish Mass concludes.

Did you recognize Father Scott Bailey? While he hasn't (yet) served at IHM, you may have recognized him as he and his family were IHM parishioners starting in 1995. If you have old parish directories, the 2005 edition has a teen-aged Scott. In the 2010 version, he's wearing a clerical collar as that was during his time in the seminary.

He served as a deacon for a few months at St Joan of Arc in Arvada before moving to St Louis in Englewood for the rest of the year. Fr Scott was ordained on May 18, 2013, and presided over his first Mass the next day at IHM. His initial assignment was as parochial vicar at St Frances Cabrini in Englewood. On June 18, 2014, he became the secretary to the Archbishop. He was appointed pastor of Risen Christ church in Denver starting June 13, 2018 - where he still serves. In early April, Risen Christ church started a renovation project.

While at the seminary, Fr Scott used his background in education & theatre when we directed fellow seminarians in "A Man for All Seasons" in 2008 and "Incident at Vichy" in 2010 (where the cast included future IHM priest Joe Do-man). While he was the Archbishop's Secretary, he got some time in the summer to direct two musicals back at St Frances Cabrini - "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat" in 2014 and "Once Upon a Mattress" in 2015.



The Colorado March for Life was held April 12 at the Capitol. There were speeches followed by a march around Civic Center Park. Council 7502 members provided logistical support to park buses carrying people to the rally. Unfortunately, the IHM bus had mechanical problems and was unable to convey parishioners to the capitol.
