GRAND KNIGHT'S LETTER – Douglas Blondin

Brother Knights, Ladies Auxiliary and IHM Congregation:

The month of June brings a couple of holidays that I'd like to highlight.

On June 2nd, we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi - also known as the Solemnity of the most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This celebrates that the Real Presence of the Lord - Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity - in the Eucharist. IHM will mark the day with a Eucharistic Procession from the church around Webster Lake and back. All are invited to participate in this visible display of our faith.

Recall that the Archdiocese of Denver is in the midst of a year-long Eucharistic Revival - which culminates with the National Eucharistic Convention in Indianapolis on July 17-21. There are four Eucharistic processions taking place across the US that will converge in Indianapolis. One of those is the St. Junipero Serra Route - it started on May 18th at the Mission Dolores Basilica in San Francisco and crosses into Northwest Colorado on June 5th. As detailed in last month's newsletter, it will pass through Denver on June 9th, with the 10:30am Mass celebrated at the Cathedral Basilica of the Immaculate Conception. This will be followed by a short (one mile) Eucharistic Procession through downtown Denver to Holy Ghost church.

On June 8th, we will celebrate a feast that should be dear to IHM parishioners - The Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This devotion allows us to contemplate the deep love Mary had for God.

Imagine what courage and faith it took to say "yes" when the angel appeared asking Mary to carry Jesus. It reminds me of a book recommended by a pastor from my home state of Vermont - "The Reed of God" by Caryll Houselander. The book is a beautiful meditation on Mary and the choice she made.

I hope you're enjoying the "Who's the Seminarian" series. My intention is to remind us of the priests (and perhaps others) with an IHM association and learn a little bit about them while seeing what they looked like back when their ministry began. This is a "space available" series, so it may not be present in every newsletter. I'm researching over 50 potential subjects.

June 14th is Flag Day. This is likely to be a tough year with a very contentious election. May the flag remind us that we are part of the United States of America and encourage us to work towards remembering those things that bring us together rather than our differences.

June will also be the start of many summer vacation travels. May these be a time of renewal and togetherness for you and your families. Safe travels.

APPROVAL OF LAST MEETING'S MINUTES: Motion to accept the April 9, 2024 Council Meeting's Minutes as published in the recent Council newsletter. Motion seconded & passed.

- Hall of Honor dinner - was held on May 4th. About 70 were in attendance to celebrate the addition of James Peterson and Brian Appelhans.
- Burrito Sales - went well on April 20th and 21st. Next sales not planned until August.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

- Fraternal Year 2024/25 Budget – GK Douglas Blondin read the budget, explained a couple items and opened the floor for discussion. There was none. A motion was made to approve the budget. That was seconded. The motion was approved (the Advocate has previously confirmed that we had a quorum for the vote).

FAMILY OF THE MONTH – CHARLIE AND KATHIE BARRETT

Our June Family of the Month has a long history together and with the Knights of Columbus. Charles and Kathie Barrett were born in the same hospital in Fort Worth, Texas in the same year, 1951. Thanks to a mutual friend, while Kathie was at Del Mar College in Corpus Christi and Charlie was at the University of Texas, Austin, they met on a blind date on Friday the 13th in 1970. They were married a year later May 28, 1971, at St. Patrick's Church in Corpus Christi, TX. Charlie was in the ROTC program hoping to be a pilot, but because he lacked 20/20 vision, could not pursue that course. Meanwhile Kathie was working at Sessions Mortgage Company, and Charlie took an interest in her work and went on to earn his BBA in finance from the University of Texas. During his 45-year career as a mortgage banker he established and later sold 2 mortgage companies.

Charlie and Kathie have two children (Kristen and Michael) and 5 grandchildren. Kristen and Steve's daughter Sydney is graduating from Holy Family HS and will pursue an Exercise Science degree at Columbia, SC on a soccer scholarship. Their son, Cal, (15) plays sports at Holy Family HS. Michael and Michelle's children Estella, Tristan and Brayden live in Thornton. Estella completed one year of college and now is active with "Journeys Kidz." Tristan (15) attends Monarch High School and is active in sports. Brayden is a 4 1/2-year-old in preschool. No wonder Charlie and Kathie chose to move to Denver in 2011.

Charlie's social involvement started in high school as a Boy Scout where he attained the status of Eagle Scout and was a member of the Order of the Arrow. Charlie joined the Knights of Columbus in June 1986 and made his 4th degree in 2021. Kathie joined the Knights' Auxiliary in 2023.

Hall of Memories Dinner

The Hall of Memories Banquet honoring Brian Appelhans and Jim Petersen was held May 4 at the hall. Grand Knight Doug Blondin and a team of five previous honorees considered nominees who had been Knights fifteen years. They weighed the totality of the nominee's contribution to the Knights of Columbus, the Church, and to the community. Simply put, this is a lifetime achievement award and a big honor. Doug Blondin was master of ceremonies. A delicious meal was prepared by Rudy Barron, Charlie Barrett, and Bob Harder. Carl Cogar and Leo Amend tended bar. Seventy family and friends were told of these Knights decades of service by Ken Allscheid and Larry Allwine.



Honoree Jim Petersen is a Council 7502 charter member.

Jim was raised on the family farm in the Brighton and Hudson, CO area. He graduated from Weld Central HS in Keenesburg in 1965. He enlisted in the Navy after high school and was deployed on an ocean going tug from 1967-68 during the Vietnam War. Jim married his lovely wife Candy in 1968. They lived in Hawaii six months till his enlistment was completed. They moved back to Colorado and to Northglenn in 1975.

Jim and Candy have two daughters, four grandchildren and one great grandchild.

Jim's father was Grand Knight of Brighton Council 3285, so Jim joined the Knights when he turned 18. He has been a Knight 60 years. He helped charter Council 7502 in March 1980. Jim joined the Fourth Degree in 2003 and served as Color Corps Commander.

In 2000 Jim along with a few other Council 7502 Knights were asked to charter a new council at St. Mark's parish. He was Treasurer, Deputy Grand Knight, Grand Knight, Trustee, a Squires Counselor. In 2010 St. Mark's chartered a Fourth Degree Assembly where Jim served as Faithful Navigator and Color Corps Commander. Jim transferred back to Council 7502 in 2020.

In 2012 State Deputy Roger Muller asked Jim to become District Deputy for District 14 covering Councils 7502, 6257, 10961, and 13131. He also became state Perpetual Memorial Society Director, which now has 2000 enrollees.

For work, Jim was a Cummins Diesel mechanic for 26 years. In a big change, he sold and maintained slot machines for five years. He then worked for Alliance Data Systems in Westminster where he retired as Chief Building Engineer.

Jim is also a member of the Elks Club and Northglenn Police Citizens Academy. He volunteers rebuilding bicycle for Northglenn's successful bike giveaway program.

For 60 incredible years of being an active Knight Jim Petersen was well deserving of being inducted into the Council 7502 Hall of Memories.



Honoree Brian Appelhans served 25 years on the Scholarship Committee.

Brian Appelhans was born and raised in Wyoming. He earned a Bachelor of Science Computer Science degree from the University of Wyoming and made a long career in software, beginning with AT&T Bell Labs and finishing in medical devices.

Brian has been married to his lovely wife Ida 43 years. They have four children.

Brian joined the Knights in 1990. He has been Chancellor and Treasurer. He served on Degree Teams and had his parts well memorized. Brian was on the Breakfast Crew 10 years, helped run golf tournaments 5 years, and worked Tootsie Rolls. Brian sang in the choir. He ran the 9 Health Fair for the Council 2 years was District Coordinator 20 years training and supporting fair sites for Northglenn and surrounding cities.

Brian has been an anchor of the Council's high school and college scholarship program, serving for 25 years.

For his 34 years of service to Council, community, and parish Brian Appelhans is a worthy new member of the Council Hall of Memories.

Father Joseph Mukasa Balikuddembe



The Council recently learned of the death of Honorary Life Member Father Joseph Mukasa Balikuddembe of Uganda. The name may not be familiar, but the story likely will be to long-time members of the parish. In October 1984, then IHM pastor Father Bill Breslin was in Rome attending a world-wide retreat for priests. He met a genial Ugandan priest and asked "What is your parish like?" The surprise response of "a pile of ashes" led to a conversation where Fr Bill learned about the situation in the Archdiocese of Kampala. Fr Balikuddembe was already scheduled to visit New York and Fr Bill invited him to come to Northglenn. At the November 25th weekend Masses, Fr Balikuddembe spoke and parishioners responded with \$21,000 in an impromptu second collection (the amount would double by January and this was during a time when parishioners had just pledged over a million dollars for the new parish center.) The money was used for purchase of a 15-ton truck to haul food & clothing to thousands of hungry, homeless refugees. The connections between the two priests continued, but was often hampered by the military censoring of letters. In 1987, IHM's Lenten program included a "Safari of Understanding" during Lent

where additional funds were raised and parishioners were involved with various prayer groups for the people of Uganda. Fr Balikuddembe last visited Fr Bill at Queen of Peace parish in September 1992 and spoke at IHM Masses on the 6th. We learned of the death when our sending of his new membership card elicited a return letter from Bishop Christopher Kakooza of the Lugazi diocese informing us that Father Balikuddembe had died on January 15, 2024. He was born on March 6, 1936, and ordained on December 11, 1966. Please keep the Ugandan people and Fr Balikuddembe in your prayers. We have entered him in the Colorado Knights of Columbus Perpetual Memorial Society.

Did you recognize Father William Breslin? Fr Bill was born in 1948 in Red Bank, New Jersey - the youngest of 4 boys. He studied at St Mary's Seminary in Baltimore, Maryland. He was ordained at St James in Red Bank, NJ, on May 18, 1974, by Bishop John C. Reiss (who you can see partly obscured by Fr Bill in the picture.) Fr Bill is walking with classmate Fr Bernie Keigher and lead by Msgr. Emmet Mo-nahan. On June 3rd at 6pm, Fr Bill will be at Queen of Peace (13120 E Kentucky Ave, Aurora) for his 50th Anniversary of Priesthood Ordination Mass.

Fr Bill started as an assistant pastor at St Mary's church in South Amboy, NJ, and chaplain of the high school. In 1977, he moved to Colorado to be closer to family (his parents had died and his brother Jack was living in Boulder). In Colorado, Fr Bill started as assistant pastor at St Mary Magdalene and later also became chaplain for Central Catholic High School.

In June 1979, Fr Bill became pastor of Immaculate Heart of Mary. Parishioners from that time will likely recall that his homilies were often punctuated with "Have I Told You Lately ... That I Love You?" - which was also the title of his column in the bimonthly "IHM Parishioner". During his IHM tenure, IHM held a capital campaign to build the parish center (Cabrini Hall et al). In 1984, Fr Bill introduced IHM to Ugandan priest Father Balikuddembe (see story on page 9).

Fr Bill transferred to Queen of Peace in Aurora in June 1987. While there, he oversaw the building of a new church. In 2001, Fr Bill became pastor of Sacred Heart of Jesus in Boulder and St Rita in Nederland. After 12 years there, he became confessor for Redemptoris Mater Seminary. Fr Bill retired in March of 2020 and resides at the Prophet Elijah priests' retirement home on the seminary grounds.
