#### GRAND KNIGHT'S LETTER - Douglas Blondin

Brother Knights, Ladies Auxiliary and IHM Congregation:

August has a number of events associated with the founder of our order, Blessed Michael J McGivney. He was born on August 12, 1852 in Waterbury, Connecticut - the eldest of 13 children who would be born to Patrick and Mary (Lynch) McGivney.

In 1868, Michael would first enter a seminary in Quebec, Canada. He later studied at a seminary near Niagara Falls, NY, before leaving in June 1873 to assist his family of the state of his father. He would require at Ct. Man's Comingration R

ly after the death of his father. He would resume studies at St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore, Maryland (the same place where Father Bill Breslin would later study) and was ordained a priest on December 22, 1877.

Building on his personal experience, Father McGivney recognized the devastating effects of the death of the wage earner in immigrant families. While an assistant pastor at St Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut, Father McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus on March 29, 1882, as a mutual aid society. While initially providing financial assistance to widows and orphans, it grew into a fraternal society.

Father McGivney died of pneumonia on August 14,1890, just after his 38th birthday.

The case for his canonization was started in 1996 in the Archdiocese of Hartford (Connecticut). On May 27, 2020, Pope Francis announced that McGivney had been approved for beautification. The beatification Mass was held on October 31, 2020, at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford, Ct. The feast day of Blessed Michael J. McGivney was established as August 13th. Please pray for another miracle to be approved so that he can be granted Sainthood.

As Margaret Mead said "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful committed individuals can change the world. In fact, it's the only thing that ever has." From those humble beginnings in 1882, the Knight of Columbus has grown to have over 2 million current members with a worldwide impact. Thanks to those who help our Council carry on that work in our corner of the world.

On August 15th, we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (a Holy Day of Obligation) – celebrating that the Mother of God, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory. This holy day was established by Pope Pius XII on November 1st, 1950.

#### Papal Commentary on Scripture of the Month

"Politics too must make room for a tender love of others. 'What is tenderness? It is love that draws near and becomes real. A movement that starts from our heart and reaches the eyes, the ears and the hands... Tenderness is the path of choice for the strongest, most courageous men and women'. [191] Amid the daily concerns of political life, 'the smallest, the weakest, the poorest should touch our hearts: indeed, they have a 'right' to appeal to our heart and soul. They are our brothers and sisters, and as such we must love and care for them.'

"All this can help us realize that what is important is not constantly achieving great results, since these are not always possible. In political activity, we should remember that, 'appearances notwithstanding, every person is immensely holy and deserves our love. Consequently, if I can help at least one person to have a better life, that already justifies the offering of my life. It is a wonderful thing to be God's faithful people. We achieve fulfilment when we break down walls and our hearts are filled with faces and names!' The great goals of our dreams and plans may only be achieved in part. Yet beyond this, those who love, and who no longer view politics merely as a quest for power, 'may be sure that none of our acts of love will be lost, nor any of our acts of sincere concern for others. No single act of love for God will be lost, no generous effort is meaningless, no painful endurance is wasted. All of these encircle our world like a vital force."

#### FAMILY OF THE MONTH - TOM AND JILL WALLS

The August 2024 Family of the Month is the Tom and Jill Walls family.

Tom was born in Chicago on October 18, 1962. He has a younger sister, Melinda, and brother, Dave. Although he attended parochial school, it was a very rough neighborhood. When he was 19, he joined the Navy to escape the situation. After serving 6 years in the Navy, he moved to Charlotte N.C. and drove a truck for 2 years. At the urging of his father, he enlisted for an additional 7 years to be with his brother. His last tour was to Fort Carson.

Jill was born in Colorado Springs and attended public schools there. She has two older sisters. Jill was working in a dental office and had two children, Brian and Amber, from a former marriage. A mutual friend introduced them. Tom introduced Jill to Catholicism. They were married on August 1, 1992. They have two additional children, Joseph (30) and Jordan (24). They now have six grandchildren with one on the way in September. Zoey (24) is a teacher in Loveland. Addison (17) is an author of a book and plays the piano in the Catholic church in South Dako-

ta. Jonathan, Gus, Camden and Mason complete the group.

Jill has worked in a dental office for 32 years. Meanwhile Tom worked his way up in CTI Charter Bus company, becoming the operations manager. When a part owner of the company retired, he sold his share to Tom. Since 2009 he has been the owner of Premier Charter Bus Company and operates 10 buses with six drivers and himself. When COVID pretty much shut down the charter bus business, he took a job driving for the Adams-12 School



District. His company has come back, but Tom stayed with Adams-12 for its retirement benefits.

Tom had decided that when he was 50, he would join the knights. The first person to invite him to join was Jim Befort. By March of 2013 he had completed his 3<sup>rd</sup> degree. He made his 4<sup>th</sup> degree in 2015. Jill joined the Ladies Auxiliary in 2014. In July 2015 they received their first Family of the Month award. They were involved in religious education, Respect Life, Coats for Kids, peach sales, breakfasts and Lenten fries. For several years Tom carried local Special Olympic teams to state competitions in Grand Junction using his bus and spending nights at the Mesa campus. As Tom took positions of youth director and chancellor, Jill held positions for the Ladies Auxiliary as corresponding secretary and hostess. Starting in 2018 Tom held more senior positions as Deputy Grand Knight under Mark Germann (2018-2020), Grand Knight (2020-2022), District Deputy (2022-2024) and is scheduled to be the state Membership Coordinator the next fiscal year.


Tom and Jill joined the Knights and Auxiliary for socialization with people who want to serve God and help their neighbors. They deserve to be the August Family of the Month.



Did you recognize Father Brian Larkin? He was born on June 28, 1980 at Mercy hospital in Denver and raised in Littleton. The middle child of three boys, he was on his way to becoming an accountant. However, God had other plans - calling him to the priesthood. Father Brian was ordained on May 21, 2011, and said his first Mass the next day at St Francis Cabrini in Littleton - his home parish.

Father Brian's first assignment was as parochial vicar at Immaculate Heart of Mary. His first Mass at IHM was the Mass of Unity (during the Journey Days festival) on June 26th. With the departure of Father Greg, Father Brian served as IHM Administrator from December 2012 until June 2013 when Father James Spahn was appointed IHM's new pastor. Father Brian would complete his three-year assignment - his presence helping Father James' transition.

On June 18, 2014, Father Brian became pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes parish in Denver. In November 2019, Our Lady of Lourdes started a major renovation – which would be completed about 9 months later. In May 2020, Father Brian was reappointed pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes for another 6 years. In May of 2021, he added the duties of pastor for St Louis in Englewood. Father Brian is known for his addiction to coffee, the beauty of the mountains, 90s music and, most importantly, following Jesus.


