

GRAND KNIGHT'S LETTER - Douglas Blondin

Brother Knights, Ladies Auxiliary and IHM Congregation:

Labor Day is upon us and is usually seen as the end-of-summer. Growing up in Vermont, Labor Day definitely brought about a change - as the next day we started the school year (we'd be in school 'til mid-June). Labor Day was also the final day of the 10-day run of the local fair - the Champlain Valley Exposition.



A week earlier, on September 15th, is the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows. The feast, originally titled "Our Lady of Compassion", was added to the Roman Missal in 1482 and varied as to when it was celebrated. It was changed to "Sorrows" in 1913 by St Pope Pius X - who also fixed the feast day to September 15th.

Our Lady of Sorrows may sound familiar as it's also the name of IHM's Adoration Chapel. Do you know that the chapel is named after an Eastlake church of the same name? Eastlake is a community a few miles north and east of IHM - dating back to 1911 when it was established as a small, rural railroad town. In 1990, most of Eastlake was annexed by Thornton in order to take advantage of the latter's sewage system - the railroad line is now the terminus of RTD's N-line.

Early Catholic residents in the area attended Mass in Welby or Brighton. As the agricultural community grew, they wanted a church of their own. Our Lady of Sorrows' cornerstone was laid at the corner of York St & Lake Ave on July 29, 1917, with work under the direction of Welby contractor Henry Cline. Upon completion, the \$3,500 construction debt was almost paid. In the early days, Servite Fathers served the mission status of the church & Servite Sisters taught Sunday School. Membership dwindled when the area hit hard times in the 1930s. The church, later a mission of St Augustine's in Brighton, closed in 1970. The building was sold to the Northglenn Masonic Club in 1971, who are still using it to this day.

September 29th is the Feast of the Archangels Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. We usually end Mass at IHM with the prayer to St Michael the Archangel. The prayer was composed by Pope Leo XIII in 1884 after seeing a horrific vision of the works of Satan in the 20th century. Over a century later, in 1994, St Pope John Paul II urged Catholics to recite this prayer frequently.

May we always labor to always keep learning, especially about our faith.

FAMILY OF THE MONTH - LYNN AND SIA RAY



The September 2024 family of the month is the family of Lynn and Sia Ray.

Lynn was born in Salt Lake City, Utah on January 18, 1952. He was the second of seven children in a family with deep Catholic roots. Lynn attended Catholic schools from preschool through high school. He earned a degree in Elementary Education in 1975 from Arizona State University. In the AFROTC program Lynn was honored as a Distinguished Graduate and went to pilot training school in Columbus AFB, MS. Lynn was on active duty 1976-1986 at which time he entered the reserves.

In May 1977 Lynn married Judy Locher with whom he had four children and 10 grandchildren. In 2004, after 28 years of marriage, Lynn filed for divorce at

the advice of his pastor. Lynn was devastated.

Sia was born in Dearborn, Michigan and grew up in the Greek Orthodox church. Her father was a chiropractor and was a civic leader. Her mother was a homemaker and was involved in community activities. In her early twenties she moved to Arizona, was married in 1981, and had two boys, Merrick and Collin. The marriage did not work out nor did a brief second marriage. She spent several years alone before seeking a companion on eHarmony.

Lynn spent 4 years after his divorce before seeking a new partner. He was attracted by Sia's entry that the person she admired most was Mother Theresa. They were married in the Church in 2012. Then in 2014, Sia's boys moved to Colorado. Merrick married Katy in 2015 and now has an 18month-old baby named Grayson – the reason Sia and Lynn moved to Colorado.

Lynn has been active with the Church as an EM, lector, and religious educator. He was heavily involved in the Boy Scouts, youth and church programs. Lynn and Sia have been selected for several backup roles in the movie. The CHOSEN.

They say IHM was a good fit for them. Sia goes to daily mass and adoration. They joined the Active Seniors which led to the Knights and Ladies Auxiliary. They did a lot of ministry work in Arizona so they welcomed being a part of a group that serves.

Did you recognize IHM parochial vicar Father Andrew Kemberling? He was born on June 21, 1957 in Tucson, Arizona. The picture is from his time as a seminarian at St John's Abbey in Collegeville, Minnesota. Father Andrew was ordained on June 11, 1988, at St Michael's parish in Canon City, Colorado by then Bishop Arthur Tafoya of Pueblo. He said his first mass later in June at his home parish - St Joseph in Tucson, AZ. Father Andrew joined the order of Benedictine Monks at Holy Cross Abbey in Canon City. In Colorado the Benedictine monks date back to 1886. The Gothic Revival monastery in Canon City was built in 1924.

Father Andrew's first assignment was as a parochial vicar under Abbot Edward Vollmer at Sacred Heart of Mary parish in Boulder. Over the years, Father Andrew would serve at Our Lady of Fatima in Lakewood, St Francis de Sales in Denver, St Francis Xavier in Pueblo and St Joseph in Grand Junction. In 2000, he was appointed administrator of St Thomas More in Centennial. Thinking that the monastery was not on a sustainable path, Father Andrew made the decision to be incardinated as an archdiocese priest in 2002. He subsequently served as pastor at St Thomas More from 2002 through 2014. (The monastery would close in 2005. The site is now The Winery at Holy Cross Abbey - using vineyards the monks had planted in 2000 in a final attempt to keep the Abbey going.)

Father Andrew was appointed pastor of St Vincent de Paul in Denver in 2014. Due to health issues, he left in November 2019 to become parochial vicar at St Francis Cabrini in Littleton. In June 2020, Father Andrew came to IHM as a parochial vicar. Father's family has a history of cooks and some recipes have been bought by national restaurant chains. In the past, Father Andrew enjoyed playing golf with priests. Due to health issues, he now enjoys the comradery of his brother priests at a monthly poker game.


